Dear Scouts, Explorers and Leaders,

Please find attached invitation form for the 2010 National Scout Air Rifle Championship, which is being held at NSRA Bisley.

Completed applications are welcomed from Scouts, Explorers, Leaders and Experienced helpers and must reach me with event fees not later than Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2010.

There are three items in the entry pack, which you should be aware of.

- 1) It is the responsibility of the Scouter in charge of each team:
  - a) to satisfy themselves that each entrant is physically capable of cocking, loading and aiming an air rifle and air pistol safely and unaided, is mentally capable of understanding the need for safety rules and is willing to obey them and has received sufficient practical instruction beforehand and has sufficient experience not to need constant correction on the range to the detriment of other shooters,
  - b) to ensure that all shooters (and, for shooters aged under 18, also their parents) are aware of these Rules and accept them, and
  - c) to obtain written parental permission to take part for all entrants under the age of 18, to ensure that the permission covers all classes of shooting an individual has entered, and bring these forms to Bisley and to have them available for inspection.
- 2) By entering, all entrants give permission for photographs to be taken at the event for the purpose of the promotion of Scouting or of target shooting. Flash photography is not permitted on ranges during shooting.
- 3) Results will be published on the event website, **www.scouts-shoot.org.uk/nsrc2k10** and by entering, all entrants give permission for their names and results to be included.

In respect of point 1, we will plan to run the NRSRA Youth Proficiency Scheme (YPS) in the run up to Bisley to ensure that best practice, sportsmanship and safety is understood by all who attend.

In addition to the application form, please also find attached a suggested kit list and health form. The completion of the health form is mandatory for all entrants regardless of age. Adults may choose to provide their health form in a sealed envelope, which unless emergency aid is required, will be returned unopened at the end of camp.

A pre-camp parents meeting will be arranged sometime in the weeks prior to camp.

I hope to see as many Scouts and Explorers attend this event as possible.

## General Notes

1. It is mandatory that your son travels to and from the camp in uniform and will be expected to wear the uniform at opening and closing ceremonies. It is expected that all Scouts and Leaders wear their neckerchief whilst on camp.
2. **5<sup>th</sup> Dartford tradition says that no Cub, Scout, Explorer or Leader wears long trousers during the day at camp. However this camp is an exception and suggest longs to be worn.**
3. Several black bin bags are great for separating clean and muddy/wet clothing as well as packing at the end of camp. They also come in handy to lay/kneel on when outdoor shooting.
4. Please place wash proof name labels in all clothing, which should have your sons name on. Scout camp is not a fashion show and designer labels are best left at home. There will be one lost property show at the end of the camp, any unclaimed items will be recycled.
5. Plates, bowls, mugs and cutlery will be provided.
6. No valuables/electronic gadgets to be taken on camp. Tents are not lockable and leaders cannot assure their safekeeping.

## Please Note

**Warm Wear** A number of layers is warmer than one thick one and the warmth can be regulated more easily - do not forget your hands and head.

**Torch** Pack your torch where you can easily locate it and if it is of a type that can be accidentally switched on whilst packed we would recommend removing a battery or inserting a piece of paper to avoid flat batteries. Please note that sunrise will be at 7:30 am and sunset at 6pm, so there will be plenty of opportunity to use torches (LED head torches are highly recommended as hands remain free.)
